PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Being a member of the Scotch College Family provides all of us with many and varied opportunities for involvement in the life of the School. Becoming an active participant in the Scotch Family can be challenging, but ultimately extremely rewarding especially for those who put so much back into the School. While for many of us the graduation of our boys from Year 12 is a great finale to our involvement in the life of the School, for some it creates a sense of loss as our opportunities for continuing involvement are diminished.

One of the great strengths of the Scotch College Foundation is that it provides real opportunities for involvement in the life of the School regardless of one's status as a member of the Scotch Family. The Foundation is made up of those supporting the School as Old Boys, as Junior and Senior School Parents, members of staff, plus others with a passion for supporting a leading educational institution. Membership and opportunities for participation in the Foundation extend well beyond Year 12 graduation.



The East Melbourne Glen Chapter for example enjoys a membership in excess of one thousand, many of them well into their 80s and 90s. Glen Chapter events are often better attended than annual dinners for most other schools with an active Alumni.

The Foundation's results for 2004 are well documented in this Annual Report and highlighted in our Executive Director's accompanying notes. My thanks to Alan Watkinson and his team in the Development Office for another outstanding year in the face of some great challenges, difficulties and a great loss felt by us all.

I count myself as being most fortunate to have attended as a student at Scotch with Campbell McComas ('69), and to have enjoyed his friendship and support over the years since we both completed our studies, and especially during my term as President of the Old Scotch Collegians' Association. Campbell, as always, was most generous with his advice and wise counsel following the death of my father Bib Stillwell ('46), another who provided a great example of generosity and active involvement in the life of the School well past his own graduation and that of his boys. To have succeeded Campbell as President of the Foundation is a great privilege. Like many of us I will miss him, his enthusiasm, leadership, support and drive to see projects and programs around the Hawthorn Campus completed and implemented.

The efforts and selfless contribution of time and expertise of past Foundation Presidents, Board Members, Development Office staff and associated supporters have built a strong and viable organisation and financial corpus for the boys attending Scotch College in the future. Our Foundation is the envy of many other

Schools; our challenge is to avoid becoming complacent as these other schools aspire to duplicate our success.

The year produced many highlights not just for the Foundation but also for the Scotch Family as a whole. My personal highlights were attending the Old Boys' Dinner where we were addressed by Major General Peter Cosgrove; the Foundation Day Concert which featured a number of outstanding individual and group musical performances; and the inaugural Year 12 Valedictory Dinner.

We cannot rest on what we have achieved. Now that the James Forbes Academy has been completed, the School is busy planning the next stage of development at our Hawthorn Campus. To continue our excellence in educational outcomes, new facilities will be planned and need funding in the years ahead. Ongoing endowments and bequests will continue to be needed to fund scholarships, bursaries, teaching positions and prizes into the future.

To achieve these outcomes we are indeed fortunate to have a welcoming and very hard working Development Office led by Alan Watkinson. While we farewelled Tania Castles and thanked her for her contribution to the School over five years, we then welcomed former Vice President of the Foundation, Astrida Cooper, to the office. Astrida brings a wealth of expertise and knowledge of the Scotch Family which will prove a most valuable asset in the years ahead.

My thanks to our Board for their contribution throughout the year. We launched the Kite Club within the Junior School under the leadership of Don Ravida. We enjoyed a fun few days at an excellent Art Exhibition and Auction organised by school parent and Foundation member Barry Pang. Our Audit Committee, led by Paul Choiselat, worked tirelessly to improve our reporting systems. My Vice Presidents David Earle and Paul Meadows provided excellent support and advice during the year. The support and hard work of all the Board throughout the year was greatly appreciated.

Our challenge lies in the year ahead. We will see some members of the board retiring and new board members will be needed to fill their places and provide fresh levels of expertise, time, effort and importantly the recruitment of new Foundation members. I look forward to many of you stepping up and joining our outstanding team at The Scotch College Foundation.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

2004 was a year filled with excitement and success, but also tinged with great sadness. It was a time of celebration and yet also of mourning. The tragic and untimely death of former President of the Foundation and true philanthropist Campbell McComas ('69) in January 2005, following a short illness, cast a pall over the end of the year. Yet through his death and the legacy which his personal philanthropy has left, he continues to challenge us all as we take on the Foundation mantle which he has now laid aside.

The key challenge is to build upon the remarkable achievements of not only 2004, but of the last five years; to celebrate the completion of the James Forbes Academy; and to develop our own vision and mission for the next five



years. We believe that success breeds further success, and so as new parents and friends join the Scotch Family, we expect that they too will join the existing Foundation members to drive Scotch College into the future.

As you will see later in this report, the Foundation performed very well in terms of new members, as well as in raising funds for the School. We welcomed 54 new members to the Foundation and were delighted that another 9 existing members increased their commitments to be awarded membership at a higher level. There are now 1085 members of the Foundation, a very strong base on which to build further membership. Financially, the Foundation enjoyed a successful year. Donations directly to the Foundation totaled \$562,993. Investment returns continued to be buoyant, and we are grateful to the Investment Committee for their wisdom and expertise in managing our investments, which at the end of the year stood at \$12,785,667. In other activities, the Foundation raised a total of \$1,101,844 for the School Building and Library Funds of which \$137,158 was raised through the Annual Giving Campaign run jointly with OSCA; and the Class of 2004 Leavers raised a further \$16,000, a fine total indeed.

The highlight of the year was probably the rapidly nearing completion of the James Forbes Academy and the first small tours around the 'work in progress'. There is no doubt that the Academy is the most spectacular achievement for the boys and staff at Scotch, and will have an impact on generations to come. The sneak preview for a few specially invited guests on 29 November showed the sheer scale of the achievement and also marked the final public appearance of Cam McComas – as himself! – before his illness forced him to The Alfred Hospital.

A second highlight was the inaugural Fine Art Exhibition and Auction held at the Hawthorn Town Hall Gallery in October. Organised and sourced by current parent Barry Pang and his business partner Anita Archer, this

spectacular event showcased leading Australian art (plus a Picasso!) and raised more than \$38,000 for the Ken Field Fund. So successful was the event, that we are resolved to run the show every two years, alternating with the Ken Field Art Show.

2004 saw the launch of the Kite Club within the Junior School. This group of Foundation members is exclusively Junior School, and the Kite is the symbol of both the aspiration of the Junior School to 'fly high' for their boys' futures at Scotch, and of one of the most popular Junior School activities in the 1930s. The inaugural cocktail party was attended by more than 60 guests, and we look forward to further growth in 2005.

I was fortunate enough to attend a number of OSCA branch dinners throughout Australia and overseas in New York and London. I was most impressed not only by the numbers attending, but also by the strong affection in which Old Boys of all generations hold the School. There is a genuine interest in what the School is doing and a desire to keep in touch with Scotch. I hope that this engagement will convert to financial support for the School as we move towards our next undertakings, following the completion of the James Forbes Academy. Such support is already evident within our Asian community. I travelled to Hong Kong, Singapore, Kuala Lumpur and Bangkok in 2004, along with the Director of Admissions and three talented musicians from years 10 and 11. We held a function in each location at which the boys played beautifully, and were able to talk to parents, Old Boys and prospective parents and students about the School from their own perspective. This was a most successful undertaking and one I hope we will be able to repeat in the future.

The bequests program of the Foundation continues to build, following the launch of the Alexander Morrison Circle in 2003. A number of Old Boys have indicated their commitment to the program with intended bequests of more than \$1 million. While some bequests are significantly large ones, there are also many smaller ones and every one of these commitments will make a genuine contribution to the future of the School and the lives of the students who pass through.

The endowment program has also been successful during 2004. One new perpetual scholarship was established anonymously; an anonymous boarding scholarship was created to provide all expenses for one student starting at Year 9 in 2005, and lasting for four years; and the end of 2004 saw a commitment from Brian and Ann Randall to establish a number of boarding scholarships over the next five years.

Such generosity is hard to truly evaluate as the impact that a scholarship can have on a boy and his family who, for financial reasons would never otherwise be able to attend Scotch College, is incalculable. We can only be most grateful to all who show such philanthropic generosity.

The East Melbourne Glen Chapter has maintained its energy during the year under the leadership of Jim Shaw ('41) and his committee. Both the Winter and Christmas luncheons were very well attended, and the guest speakers kept us truly enthralled during their presentations. While we were saddened to hear of 81 deaths from the Chapter during the year, we were delighted to welcome more than 100 new members – so we grow from strength to strength.

Callers to the Development Office will have noticed a number of staff changes during the year. Tania Castles resigned as Development Officer in April and I am delighted to report that Astrida Cooper, at that time Vice-President of the Foundation, was appointed to the position, having resigned her office. Astrida is well known to the Scotch Community and has already brought her own warm and welcoming personality and quiet efficiency to the role. Monika Matlik, Events Co-ordinator for OSCA, resigned to take up a position at Tintern School. Dr Jill Spargo leaves the Board as the School

Council representative, and we thank her for all her many hours of hard work on behalf of both the Foundation and the School. She has been replaced by Gordon Walker whom we welcome most warmly.

Throughout the year I have had very strong support from the Members of the Board of Trustees, and

especially from the President Michael Stillwell, and Vice-Presidents David Earle, Astrida Cooper and Paul Meadows. Similarly, Tim Shearer and the OSCA Council have shown their strong commitment to the Foundation and the Development Office and the links between OSCA and the Foundation continue to strengthen. To all the team members from OSCA, OSCA-net and Foundation, and to tireless secretary Susan Mackay, I express my thanks for their energy, enthusiasm and commitment. I am also most grateful for the guidance and support of the Chairman of the School Council, Michael Robinson, the Principal, Dr Gordon Donaldson, and the Bursar, Neil Roberts who retires from Scotch in 2005 after 20 years of outstanding service.

2005 will present its own challenges but also the thrill associated with the opening of the James Forbes Academy. The Foundation has performed well and is in a very strong position to move forward to meet its challenges and continue its invaluable support for the School and its many and diverse needs.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

SCOPE

The Financial Report and Trustees' Responsibility

The financial report comprises the statement of financial position, statement of financial performance, statement of cash flows, accompanying notes to the financial statements, and the declaration by the Board of Trustees for The Scotch College Foundation (Inc) for the year ended 31 December 2004.

The Board of Trustees of the Foundation are responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Act 1981. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Audit Approach

We conducted an independent audit in order to express an opinion to the members of the Foundation. Our audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards in order to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgement, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal control, and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

We performed procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly, in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 including compliance with Accounting Standards and other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia, a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Foundation's financial position, and of its performance as represented by the results of its operations and cash flows.

We formed our audit opinion on the basis of these procedures, which included:

- examining, on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report, and
- assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the Board of Trustees.

While we considered the effectiveness of management's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our audit was not designed to provide assurance on internal controls.

Independence

In conducting our audit, we followed applicable independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

Audit Opinion

In our opinion, the financial report of The Scotch College Foundation (Inc) is in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Act 1981, including:

- giving a true and fair view of The Scotch College Foundation (Inc) financial position as at 31 December 2004 and of its performance for the year ended on that date; and
- complying with Accounting Standards in Australia and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia.

The Scotch College Foundation (Incorporated)**NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS****FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2004****1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been drawn up in accordance with Accounting Standards, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and the Associations Incorporation Act 1981.

The statements are prepared on an accrual and going concern basis from the records of the Foundation.

(a) Income Tax

The Foundation is exempt from income tax under Section 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 as an educational institution.

(b) Investments

Pursuant to the Scotch College Common Fund Act 2001 Scotch College established an investment common fund for the collective investment of the trust funds.

Gardiner Hill Pty Ltd, a wholly owned subsidiary of Scotch College, has been appointed as trustee of the Common fund.

The Trustee has delegated consideration of investment matters to the investment committee of Scotch College.

In accordance with the Rules of the Scotch College Common Fund, The Scotch College Foundation (Inc), as an investor:

- has a beneficial interest in the Common Fund as a whole, but no interest in any particular asset of the Common Fund; and
- has a right to distributable income calculated in accordance with the Rules. Distributable income includes income, profit, gains, deductions and expenses.

The investment in the Scotch College Common Fund is valued on the basis of the market value of the underlying assets held in the Fund at Balance Date before deducting any realisation costs. Gains and losses in the market value of the investment are brought to account in the Statement of Financial Performance. The maximum credit risk exposure is represented by the carrying amount of the investment.

(c) Transfers to Scotch College

In accordance with rule 39(b) of the Foundation's Constitution an amount representing 50% of the corpus income has been transferred to the College.

The Scotch College Foundation (Inc) considers Scotch College, Gardiner Hill Pty Limited and Old Scotch Collegians' Association (OSCA) to be related parties for the purposes of AAS 22.

The Foundation had nil employees at 31 December 2004 (2003: Nil employees). The salaries and wages of persons employed in the Development Office and other administrative expenses are paid by Scotch College and reimbursed by the Scotch College Foundation (Inc). to the extent of the amount disclosed as Administrative Expenses. Audit fees for the Foundation of \$3,500 (2003: \$3,000) are borne by Scotch College.

In accordance with rule 39(b) of the Foundation's Constitution an amount representing 50% of the corpus income has been transferred to the College. This amount is disclosed on the Statement of Financial Performance.

7. OTHER INFORMATION

The Scotch College Foundation (Inc) is an incorporated association, incorporated in Australia. The registered office is 1 Morrison Street, Hawthorn, Victoria.

At reporting date The Scotch College Foundation (Inc) had received notification of bequests and pledges. Corresponding amounts have not been brought to account where such amounts do not satisfy recognition criteria established by accounting standards.

8. ADOPTION OF INTERNATIONAL FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS

Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS) will be adopted in the financial report for the year ending 31 December 2005 and the comparative information presented in that report for the year ending 31 December 2004. In preparation for the transition, opening balances as at 1 January 2004 for the comparative year ending 31 December 2004 will be converted to AIFRS in accordance with new accounting standard AASB 1 'First Time Adoption of Australian International Financial Reporting Pronouncements'.

The transition to AIFRS is being managed by the Board of Trustees. Expert technical advice will be sought as necessary.

There are no significant differences in accounting policies expected to arise from adoption of AIFRS. The Foundation's only asset, the investment in the common fund, will continue to be measured at market value with increments and decrements recognised in the income statement.
