Did you know?

Scotch has 360 boys playing basketball this year across 31 teams. This impressive participation rate is bringing basketball close to being the number one sport at Scotch, with its popularity increasing each year.

Most APS schools have reported similar trends, predicting that basketball will soon overtake and become the No. 1 participative sport. In many of Sydney's private schools, basketball has already been the most popular sport since 2022, and this trend shows no signs of slowing down.

The rising popularity of basketball is strongly linked to the success of the national NBL competition, the quality of Australian players in the NBA, and the performances of our national teams – the Boomers and the Opals.

According to data from the Australian Sports Commission, basketball was officially the most requested school sport in Australia in 2022. The data also stated that over 1.1 million Australians over the age of 15 played basketball last year – a 64 percent increase since 2016 and the number of children under 15 playing the sport has also risen significantly from 291,200 in 2016 to almost half a million in 2022. This upward trend is expected to continue.
