THE PLAY: The Venetian Twins by Carlo Goldoni

A love letter to the 1980s full of slapstick and fun. Twins separated at birth turn up in Beverley Hills, one for an arranged marriage and the other to meet a girl who has run away from her family for him. They are mistaken for each other and the resulting chaos includes karate fights, betrayals, arguments, arrests, a casket of stolen jewels, and a death from poisoned wine: the show's comic high point!

THE REHEARSALS

The rehearsals will be held mainly on Friday and Sunday afternoons at Scotch College, however there may be other rehearsals on Monday afternoons where necessary. Play: The Venetian Twins

Author: Carlo Goldoni translated by Michael Feingold

Role: TONY

TONY: So that's all friendship means to them nowadays. Floyd came to Venice Beach; I treated him like my own brother. Then I trust him, I put a woman under his care who's the most important thing in my life, and he stabs me in the back! How can a friend have the gall to do that to you? If I did such evil things, I'd be afraid the earth would open up and swallow me. Friendship is the world's most sacred gift. It's a medicine sent by nature to heal the world; without it we'd be destroyed, annihilated. A man's love for a woman can start as a lower kind of passion. A love for money and things is a sign of our sinful nature. But the love of friends is based on real virtue, which is why the world seems to think so little of it. As the great Bon Jovi said so beautifully: "Shot through the heart and you're to blame, Buddy, you give love a bad name."

Role: ZANE

(ROSANNA disappears from window.)

ZANE. (Calling after her.) I'm sure it'll be all right once we're married. (Seeing she's gone.) This one calls me "scoundrel," the other one says "brute". This one "cheat," that one "savage." What can go wrong? Poor Zane! I'm desperate. They all hate me. Nobody loves me. I'll never get married. If I had a pair of aviator sunglasses, I'd wear them to hide my tears. If I had a Walkman, I'd listen to the songs that remind me of her. If I had a Rubik's Cube, I'd think about the nights I spent alone trying to solve it without you. Women fight over me in jealousy, and I'm caught between then don't get to put a word in. Any of you women out there want me? I'm not all that ugly. No, I can tell, nobody wants me. They all hate me. They all hate me! It's all because I'm so handsome. I curse my good looks, and my miserable fate!

Role: ROSANNA

(ZANE tries to embrace ROSANNA; she slaps him.)

ROSANNA. How dare you! (ZANE, astonished, stands stock still, touching his hand to his cheek. Staring straight at ROSANNA, he makes the motion of the slap, bows to her, and runs out without saying a word.) God in Heaven! What a vulgar man! How could he be so coarse? I never would have believed it; at first glance he only seemed a little foolish. But it shows you that looks are deceiving. Even a wolf can wear sheep's clothing. It's not safe for a woman to be left alone with any man. There's always some danger in it. Dear Christopher has told me so time and again - Oh, but there he is. Really, just one look at his face and you can tell what a good heart he has.

Role: BEATRICE

BEATRICE. (Coming in between ZANE and his view of ROSANNA.) You traitor! You ingrate! You liar! This is how you keep your vow of fidelity? You just promised to marry me, and now you betray me? This is the third time you've fed me the same lie! Look at me, you monster, look me in the eye, if you can bear to do so. But no, you're blushing, you're covered with shame, shaking with fright at my anger. You low creature! Heartless fiend! Filthy liar! Why did you lure me from my father's house? Make me desert my friends? Why did you swear you'd marry me, if your heart belonged to another woman? If someone had told me you were so evil, I would never have believed it. But now I've seen the truth with my own eyes, the truth of my shame, my betrayal, my humiliation. I'll never trust you again. I no longer love you. You savage, I release you from your promise. (BEATRICE runs off)
